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1. Since PILOTE was first conceived, the KS2 Framework has been published and modern languages is becoming an entitlement for all primary aged children. It includes all 4 language learning skills in a revised KS2 curriculum.
2. Until now, the Kent initiative has mainly concentrated on speaking, listening and reading tasks, as there was no dedicated curriculum time for Primary MFL. The Framework makes reference to the progressions expected in the newly allocated time slots. Given that there will be time and staffing more can be delivered at KS2 and some writing may now be possible for some children as appropriate.
3. Oracy should precede literacy. The writing activities should only be introduced after the children are very familiar with the vocabulary and structures. The sound spelling links can be highlighted once they have internalised the language and it is very secure.
4. The Framework refers to "familiar" words and phrases so until these are familiar, avoid writing things down or expecting the children to write. When you know that the children are very familiar with the words start to introduce the literacy elements. Make a professional judgement about your individual pupil's readiness for the demands of the different skills.
